MISSING JESUS

(Virtual Easter Sunday)

THE STORY OF EASTER HAS ALWAYS FOCUSED ON JESUS

- A. A harder story for the world to grasp compared to Christmas
 - 1. Babies and births more embraceable than crosses and death
 - 2. Christmas gifts far better than Easter gifts
 - 3. The Easter bunny is a pretty second rate icon
 - 4. Quick think of your favorite Easter song
- B. Easter starts as a dark story with a powerful ending
 - 1. Jesus died a horrific death on the cross for our sins
 - 2. He was buried in a sealed tomb and rose again on the third day
 - 3. He offers eternal salvation and a life with God to anyone who believes (1 Peter 1:3 NIV)
- C. With everything happening due to this virus crisis easy to miss Jesus

FOUR PEOPLE WHO MISSED JESUS

- A. Pilate (Matthew 27:22-24 NKJV)
 - 1. He was conflicted about Jesus knew He was innocent
 - 2. He had the power to make the right choice
- B. One of the two thieves crucified beside Jesus (Luke 23:39 NIV)
 - 1. Challenged the legitimacy of Jesus aren't you the Messiah?
 - 2. Could have made a different decision
- C. Two men on the road to Emmaus (Luke 24:21 NKJV)
 - 1. Encountered the resurrected Jesus and didn't know it
 - 2. Disappointment with how things turned out caused them to miss Jesus

WE DON'T WANT TO MISS HIM - HOW DO WE FIND JESUS IN THESE CHALLENGING TIMES

- A. Don't give into the increased pressure around us
 - 1. We, as Pilate, have the ability to make the right choice
 - 2. Pressure from mockers, doubters, reasoners and the majority
 - 3. A response to pressure is often the easiest path of least resistance easiest not usually best (*Philippians 4:13 NKJV*)
- B. We don't lash out in our pain like the thief on the cross
 - 1. This virus situation has compounded the pain in our lives some of it pre-existing
 - 2. Pain rarely brings out the best in us we can lash out at others and even God
 - 3. We respectfully reach out to the One who understands and heals our pains (Isaiah 53:4-5 NIV)
- C. Open our hearts to the Hope that is with us
 - 1. Many are disappointed now with how things have turned out
 - 2. The two men on the road to Emmaus responded from their hearts even in their disappointment
 - 3. We don't demand to see or feel we open our hearts to Him (Revelation 3:20 NKJV)
