THE DIFFERENT RESPONSES OF THE TWO SPIES

- Insight into the bigger, better vision of Caleb and Joshua (Joshua 14:7-8 NKJV)
 - 1. Brought word as it was in his heart
 - 2. Wholly followed God

How WE SEE THINGS

- Three key areas of vision
 - 1. How we see God
 - 2. How we see ourselves
 - 3. How we correlate this into our lives

GETTING IT WRONG GETTING IT RIGHT

- The right view of the master (Matthew 25:20-21 NKJV)
 - 1. The master gave his servants his goods
 - 2. He praised them for doing well
 - 3. He advanced them gave them greater responsibility
- The wrong view of the master (Matthew 25:24-25 NKJV)
 - 1. He saw the master as a hard man and a thief
 - 2. His perception led him to be afraid

THE BLIND MAN WHO SAW (Mark 10:46-52 NKJV)

- He "saw" Jesus
 - 1. He saw Jesus as the Son of David
 - 2. He saw Jesus as the healer
 - 3. He saw Jesus as merciful/good
 - 4. All this was based on what Bartimaeus heard (Psalm 119:130 NKJV)
- When it became personal
 - 1. The people were not for Bartimaeus
 - 2. He did not know if Jesus was for him until Jesus called for him
 - 3. Bartimaeus stopped seeing himself as a blind man
 - 4. He received his healing

How Do WE SEE GOD?

- · Against us, for us, or neutral?
 - 1. Jesus gave us a great picture (John 14:7-9 NKJV)
 - 2. The Father's love (John 3:16-17 NKJV)
 - 3. God's stance toward us (Romans 8:31-32 NKJV)
- Bringing the light home (Psalm 119:162-165 NKJV)
 - 1. Rejoicing at God's Word as if it's valuable
 - 2. Turning away from what is not true loving what is
 - 3. Praising God for His word and His goodness
 - 4. Loving God's Word causes peace and light
