## CONFIDENCE: A STATE OF HOPEFULNESS THAT EVENTS WILL BE FAVORABLE. A SENSE OF TRUST IN SOMEONE.

- Confidence builders
  - 1. Act positive: Action is a key to developing self confidence
  - 2. Become more competent practicing and learning
  - 3. Stand up tall feeling better about yourself
- Confidence with God? (Hebrews 10:35 NKJV)
  - 1. Don't throw your confidence away we keep things that are valuable
  - 2. Confidence has a great reward
  - 3. Confidence in God is directly related to our connection with Him

## A LADY WHO STAYED CONNECTED IN A CRISIS

- A heart for God (2 Kings 4:8-10 NKJV)
  - 1. Elisha represented God
  - She had a place built for the prophet and expected nothing in return
- Her actions and words indicated a woman connected (2 Kings 4:20-23 NKJV)
  - 1. She put her boy in a special place a place that represented God
  - 2. She was hurting but not panicked still courteous to her husband
  - 3. Her words were strong words of faith and hope
- She stayed connected to her source of help (2 Kings 4:27&30 NKJV)
  - 1. She poured her heart out to the one who could change things
  - Even though Elisha sent his servant
  - 3. The Lord used Elisha to raise the boy from the dead (2 Kings 4:37 NKJV)

## **BUILDING A CONNECTION THAT INCREASES CONFIDENCE**

- Have a heart for God
  - 1. Have a place in our heart that acknowledges and honors God
  - 2. A heart to see His Kingdom expand (Matthews 6:33 NKJV)
  - 3. This is not a one way relationship we honor Him / He honors us
- Speak and act like someone connected with God (1 Corinthians 6:19-20 NKJV)
  - 1. We are His He is our Maker and the One who bought us back
  - 2. Not panicking or giving into fear acting as if He is real and cares for us
  - 3. Our words have life in them confident words
- · Stav connected to Him
  - 1. During these challenging times we need His help
  - 2. After these days are over we'll still need Him (Psalm 62:8 NKJV)
