WHEN THE FUTURE DOES NOT LOOK PROMISING

- The Stockdale Paradox
 - 1. Face the hard facts of the current reality
 - 2. Couple that with a never ending faith that you will prevail in the end
- The believer's paradox
 - 1. We face and do not deny the current reality even when it's hard
 - 2. We have faith that we will prevail in the end
 - 3. The difference (1 Corinthians 15:57 NKJV)

WHEN THE FUTURE LOOKED BLEAK TO THE NATION OF ISRAEL

- · The voice of the majority
 - 1. Although the land is good there are big problems associated with it literal giants
 - 2. We can not handle this we are too weak and too small
- When the majority voices were believed (Numbers 14:1-4 NKJV)
 - 1. The people cried all night
 - 2. They complained about the leadership
 - 3. Denied the goodness of God
 - 4. Were making plans to return to slavery giving up on God's plan
- Two men with a different vision of the future (Numbers 14:6-9 NKJV)
 - 1. These two believed that the future looked promising
 - 2. Joshua and Caleb believed that the Lord would help them
 - 3. Because of what these men believed ... They were not afraid of the future

YOUR VISION OF THE FUTURE (Proverbs 29:18a KJV)

- Face the hard facts facing you but...
 - 1. Don't stop with just the facts
 - 2. Don't magnify the facts
- · On purpose bring God into your facts and into your future
 - 1. He will not force His way into your life
 - 2. Choose to believe He is bigger than your problems and can help you (Hebrews 11:6 NKJV)
 - 3. Talk God's help more than you talk the problem
- Ask yourself this question: What do I see for the future, my future?
 - 1. If you are weeping, sad and complaining
 - 2. Smiling, glad and rejoicing (1 Samuel 2:1b NKJV)
