Part 3: The Courage to Continue

IF IT WAS EASY EVERYONE WOULD DO IT

- Courage is required...
 - 1. When it's not convenient
 - 2. When it's not comfortable
 - 3. When there is conflict
- Our walk with the Lord requires courage (1 Corinthians 16:13-14 NKJ)
 - 1. Good reasons that military / athletic metaphors are used
 - 2. We need to be brave for a reason not everything will be easy

WHEN ONE MOTHER'S COURAGE INSPIRED A KING (2 Samuel 21:8-11 & 13 NKJ)

- Rizpah was not in any kind of advantageous position
 - 1. She did not have the rights of marriage
 - 2. Her protector / provider Saul, was dead
- She took on an extremely hard job
 - 1. Not allowing the bodies of her sons to be desecrated
 - 2. Uncomfortable and dangerous
 - 3. Compelled by love for her sons
- · Her courage and commitment motivated David to act
 - 1. He finally gave Saul and Jonathan a proper burial
 - 2. He also removed the bones of the seven fallen men Rizpah's sons

DEVELOPING THE COURAGE TO CONTINUE

- The bigger the purpose the better the motivation
 - 1. We all need a purpose bigger than just ourselves
 - 2. A desire to make a difference is a strong purpose love motivated
 - 3. A big purpose is what gave Jesus the courage to continue (Hebrews 12:2 NKJ)
- Have the right mindset ahead of time
 - 1. Not trying to see if it works out
 - 2. Be willing to push past quitting points
 - 3. There is a Christ like mindset we can adopt (1 Peter 4:1 NKJ)
- Your courage to continue can inspire others, honor God and bless your life
 - 1. It strengthens others to see you continue they can do it also
 - 2. There are benefits to not quitting (Galatians 6:9 NKJ)
