How We Approach Biblical Topics Determines To What Extent We Receive Help And Insight

A. A group of people who rejected Jesus (Luke 9:51-56 NKJV)

- 1. The tradition of the Samaritans caused them to reject Jesus
- 2. Jesus did not punish them, rebuke them or stay with them

B. Another group with the same traditional prejudices moved beyond tradition (John 4:39-42 NKJV)

- 1. They were open to Jesus because of His interaction with one of their ladies
- 2. They invited Him to stay with them and He did
- These Samaritans actually received insight as to who Jesus was that many Jews missed (Mark 4:9 NKJV)

THE HOLY SPIRIT IN THE OLD TESTAMENT

A. Active in creation

1. Helps us understand how the creation story could be written - He was there

B. He was the empowering force behind the Old Testament "heroes"

- 1. David was empowered before facing Goliath (1 Samuel 16:13 NKJV)
- 2. Gideon progressed from hiding from the neighbors to leading a nation into battle
- 3. Samson was able to do supernatural feats of strength (Judges 14:6 NKJV)

C. He still empowers people today (Acts 1:8 NKJV)

1. He equips us to face giants, move out of fear and exhibit amazing strength

D. The Holy Spirit was spoken about by the Old Testament prophets

- 1. Isaiah described His characteristics (Isaiah 11:2 NKJV)
- Ezekiel spoke of a coming day, which is now, the time frame we are living (Ezekiel 36:26-27 NKJV)
- 3. Joel spoke of the coming day and the Holy Spirit's outpouring (Joel 2:28-29 NKJV)
