- Observation #2: She heard about Jesus and believed what she heard about him.
 - o And it is impossible to please God without faith. Anyone who wants to come to Him must believe that God exists and that He rewards those who sincerely seek Him. (Hebrews 11:6 NLT)
- Observation #3: When you can get close to the Lord, things begin to happen immediately.

- Observation #2: Habakkuk went up to a higher place while he waited for the Lord's answer. A place
 of silence or solitude. The Lord did answer. You don't have to wait for Sunday or Wednesday to hear
 from God.
 - Yet I am confident I will see the LORD's goodness while I am here in the land of the living. ¹⁴ Wait patiently for the LORD. Be brave and courageous. Yes, wait patiently for the LORD. (Psalm 27:13,14 NLT)
 - My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me. (John 10:27 NLT) no slide

- <u>Observation #3:</u> No longer moved by or anxious over the current circumstances, he set his sights on things above: on God above. God became the source of his strength & joy.

 - The expectations of the righteous result in joy, but the hopes of the wicked will perish. (Proverbs 10:28 CEB)
- Observation #3: Your actions to get close to him have the potential to positively affect your entire
 household.
