THE LAST WORD

A. Different applications

- 1. The last thing said in an argument
- 2. The right to make a directive that must be followed
- 3. Information/fact that is considered to be the best

EASTER'S LAST WORD

A. Meant Peter's mistake would not have to define him

- 1. With Jesus for three years; part of the inner circle; top leadership candidate
- 2. In a moment of fear and confusion he denied any involvement with Jesus
- 3. But God singled him out not for punishment, for forgiveness (Mark 16:6-7 NIV)

B. Meant the disciple's fear would not cripple them

- 1. An extremely difficult time for this group
- 2. The resurrected Jesus had an answer for their fears (John 20:19-21 NIV)

C. Meant that death was not nearly as final

- 1. Jesus went to the grave of a friend and offered more that kind words (John 11:25 NKJ)
- 2. A few days after this Jesus Himself was raised from the dead

WHEN EASTER HAS THE LAST WORD IN YOUR LIFE

A. You have freedom from your past

- 1. Many have been like Peter and allowed their past mistakes to define them
- 2. If Jesus loved you enough to go the cross and God loved you enough to raise Him up *(Romans 4:25 NLT)*

B. You have new strength for today

- 1. Life can be hard, pressures and problems
- 2. When challenges rise up it's not uncommon to lock the doors and hide
- 3. But Jesus who conquered all life/death could throw at Him gave you a promise *(Hebrews 13:5b 6 NKJ)*

C. You have hope for the future

- 1. Life comes at you fast the older you get the faster it comes
- 2. No matter how pristine your past or vibrant your strength is for today all of us face death
- 3. Because of Easter, because Jesus was raised from the dead you can have a hope past this life *(1 Corinthians 15:55 NIV)*
