(The Push for 3)

THE CHRISTIAN LIFE

- Defined by what we don't do (Titus 2:11-14 NLT)
 - 1. We say no to living in ways that don't honor God
- Also defined by what we do
 - 1. Living with an expectation of Jesus' return
 - 2. Totally committed to doing good

PETER'S FIRST AMAZING ENCOUNTER WITH THE LORD (Luke 5:1-11 NKJV)

- Jesus had a need, Peter was the answer
 - 1. People were pressing against Him
 - 2. Jesus asked Peter to help He did not command or beg
 - 3. By holding the boat, Peter helped Jesus get the message out
- Peter had plenty of reasons not to get involved
 - 1. He was busy working he was tired and had just worked all night
 - 2. Helping was not convenient Jesus probably taught for more than 30 minutes
 - 3. Peter was not the most spiritual guy plus he just had a bad night
 - 4. This was not really a status job
- Peter's service opened a door to the Lord
 - 1. After helping Jesus, he was given a word
 - 2. Peter took a step of faith and was blessed above his ability
 - 3. Peter's willingness to help and willingness to obey changed his life

SERVING THE LORD HERE AT THE ARK

- Jesus has a need, you are the answer
 - 1. The Lord still uses people to get His message out
 - 2. Whatever you do, do it for Him (Ephesians 6:5-8)
- There will always be reasons to not serve
 - 1. Too busy, too tired, too sad, too unspiritual
 - 2. Not in a good space, not fit my personality profile, not enough status, not my passion
 - 3. The good news: He will help you overcome the too's and the not's (1 Corinthians 15:57-58 NLT)
- Serving opens the door to more of God in your life
 - 1. God does not forget what you do for Him (Hebrews 6:10 NLT)
 - 2. Serving the Lord helps Him helps others, and helps you
