What Can We Learn From Naaman's Story?

1. Pride Will Keep Us From Experiencing All That God Has For Us

- a. He was a very proud man/status made him that way.
- b. When Elisha did not see him directly, he became offended. Disrespected.
- c. His first response to his unmet expectations was to give up and go home.

- Pride comes in many different forms.
 - o Thinking we are better than others.
 - Thinking that certain tasks are beneath us.

2. Who You Have Around You Matters

- b. Dip = plunge or immerse something or someone.
- c. When Naaman went into the water, he went all in. Completely submerged.
- d. He became a **DOER** and not just a **HEARER**!
