- I. Introduction
  - A. Do you prefer to be the driver or the passenger?
  - B. What are you holding on to in life?
- II. The Rich Young Ruler (Luke 18:18-25 NIV)
  - A. He approached Jesus
    - B. Who was he?
      - 1. Matthew says that he was young, so likely between 20-40
      - 2. Luke says that he was a ruler, either of the synagogue or even the Sanhedrin.
      - 3. Matthew, Mark, and Luke all write that he was rich
    - C. He was a rare individual at that time because most were poor and oppressed.
    - D. He wanted to inherit a place in God's kingdom
      - 1. The Jewish people believed that one day God would bring His kingdom to earth.
      - 2. He was well-verse in God's law.
    - E. Jesus' request
      - 1. Jesus' invitation to join as a disciple was a genuine invitation.
      - 2. The man had an offer to receive everything he asked for, but he wouldn't take it because of what he had to give up.
- III. Why Did He Reject Jesus?
  - A. Jesus' request cut through the externals actions and went right to his heart.
  - B. His possessions were his god. They led his life's choices and actions.
  - C. Losing his wealth could have a cascading effect of losing the life he knew and enjoyed. It was too much risk.
  - D. He couldn't give up control of his life to Jesus.
- IV. The Disconnect
  - A. We cannot control everything in life no matter how hard we try.
  - B. The disconnect between our desire to control and our inability to control is where anger and fear are nurtured.
  - C. The harder we control, the more of what we want slips through our fingers.
  - D. Letting go means turning to a new leader, Christ.
    - 1. The Rich Young Ruler wanted God as an advisor, not a king.
    - 2. We have to trust in God's ability to control and lead more than we trust our own ability.
- V. Leading vs. Following
  - A. We like to lead but hate to follow.

- 1. There is only one leader in the Christian life.
- 2. Usurping that role leads to trouble.
- B. Repent and believe
  - 1. This phrase means more than just be sorry and believe.
  - 2. Others in the culture used this phrase.
  - 3. When Jesus used that phrase, He wanted the person to stop following their current leader, turn, and follow Him.
  - 4. Following Jesus puts our belief into action.
- VI. Jesus' Prescription
  - A. Matthew 6:25 (NIV)
  - B. Matthew 6:33 (NIV)
    - 1. To seek the kingdom, you have to seek the King
    - 2. The things you are searching for come running to you when you trust Jesus' leadership.
  - C. Matthew 6:10 (NIV)
    - 1. Jesus prayed this sentiment in the garden.
    - 2. This is a prayer that welcomes God to be in charge now and in the future.
    - 3. The more we yield ourselves to God, the greater the yield of blessings will be in our lives.
