I WILL

A. One Of The Strongest Phrases We Use

- 1. An act of your will indicates a choice and a decision
- 2. Also signifies a fixed persistent intent
- 3. Much more powerful than I'll try or we'll see

B. Using I Will To Help (Proverbs 18:21 NKJV)

1. Speaking life to your situation

WHEN I WILL WENT WRONG (John 20:24-29 NIV)

A. Thomas had opportunities to believe

- 1. Jesus had repeatedly said He would rise from the dead
- 2. Thomas knew the disciples well

B. Thomas made the choice not to believe

- 1. His choice defined by his words "I will not"
- 2. He could have just as easily said I will believe that
- 3. Thomas chose to wait for physical evidence

C. Jesus did not praise or excuse Thomas

- 1. Did not indicate that Thomas gave it a good try
- Jesus did not indicate that Thomas was incapable of believing
- Jesus defined who are the blessed
- 4. This account was written to help us, not shame Thomas

USING "I WILL" TO POWER UP IN THREE AREAS (strengthen resolve, establish direction)

A. I will trust God (Psalm 91:2 NKJV)

- 1. David was a man who had to trust God to live
- 2. David was also a man who had a lot to say about God
- 3. Instead of voicing our doubts and uncertainty

B. I will not fear (Psalm 118:6 NKJV)

- 1. We can choose to not give voice to fear
- 2. Fear is a big part of the environment we live in
- 3. Because we have a relationship with God

C. I will rejoice (Psalm 9:1-2 NKJV)

- 1. This psalm gives us the freedom to choose another path
- 2. We can join the ranks of the blessed
