POSITIVE ACTIONS FOR NEGATIVE TIMES

Part 1 - Why Sit Here?

AN EXTREMELY NEGATIVE SITUATION (2 Kings 7:3-4 NKJV)

- · Most likely not a short term problem
 - 1. People with leprosy were always quarantined
- The situation goes from bad to worse
 - 1. Famine in the city meant isolation and no resources
 - 2. The Syrian army threatening to wipe out everyone

UNWILLING TO SIT AND WAIT FOR DEATH

- They honestly looked at their situation
 - 1. They did not sugarcoat
 - But they were looking from an action perspective what can we do?
- Willing to take a risk
 - 1. Adopted a course of action the only one that could keep them alive
 - 2. Already had factored in the worst case scenario
 - 3. Action albeit risky is better than waiting for the inevitable

GOD'S INVOLVEMENT (2 Kings 7:5-8 NKJV)

- The Lord caused...
 - 1. It was only four men but
 - 2. Fear can yield to wild speculation the Syrians "figured out" what was happening
- Their cup ran over
 - 1. The four men were fed and enriched
 - The most unlikely became the bearers of good news (2 Kings 7:9 NKJV)

POSITIVE ACTIONS FOR THESE NEGATIVE TIMES

- · When you feel "stuck" in a negative situation
 - 1. When it goes long it can wear you down
 - 2. When it seems there are no options easy to get used to just sitting and waiting
- Don't just settle
 - 1. Don't adopt an "it is what it is" mentality
 - 2. With God there is always some form of action we can take (2 Corinthians 5:7 NKJV)
- · Acts of our faith
 - 1. We want to give God something to work with
 - 2. We can rejoice in the Lord (*Philippians 4:4 NKJV*)
 - 3. We can pray (Philippians 4:6-7 NKJV)
 - 4. We can give thanks (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 NKJV) (Psalm 69:30 NKJV)
